

So, yes, I would say that a Christian, that is anointed by God with the Holy Spirit, has the free will to make poor choices, and if those choices result in putting their faith in the elements of this world, above or on top of the foundation of Christ, and their works are not worthy of the temple of God, they will be left behind in the rapture, or as it says THE DAY, and they will suffer. However their soul will not be lost, because God is not a liar, and in **2 Cor 1:21-22** Now **He** who establishes us with you **in Christ** and has **anointed** us is **God**, who also has **sealed us and given us the Spirit** in our hearts as a guarantee. So it appears that because certain Christians do not pick up their cross and follow in Christ's footsteps and live out their salvation(Phil 2:12), they have to prove it during the tribulation, and God will remind them that He is the God of their salvation. I love the fact that it says they will be rescued. That seems to go hand in hand with all of us who have been given dreams that appear to be rescue dreams in a more dystopian setting.

What if this is you? Is it too late to repent and reverse course and get on track. No. It's not too late. God loves us all, and he wants us all to come to him in humility and be on track. That is why he gave us the Bible, so we would know how to live. He is in our corner. Simply ask for forgiveness, and ask the Holy Spirit to help you place your entire foundation on Christ, even if you don't know how that looks for you, even if there are impossible looking dynamics in your personal situation to allow this to occur, when you ask, the Lord will make a way. Trust Him.

What if you happen upon this after the rapture? Repent, and get right with the Lord and hand onto this verse.

Phil 1:19 because I know that through your prayers and provisions of the Spirit of Jesus Christ, my distress will turn out for my deliverance.

Joel 2:17 points out that the Priests of the Lord will be begging the Lord on your behalf. "Spare your people, O Lord"

also this:

Romans 5:1-5 Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through your Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we also have access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and rejoice in the hope the glory of God. And not only that, but we also glory in tribulations, knowing the tribulation produces perseverance; and perseverance, character; and character, hope. Now hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit who was given to us.
